はしがき

世界に広がる本大会

第17回山寺芭蕉記念館英語俳句大会
実行委員長 大場 登

「山寺から世界へ」という思いを込めて始まったこの大会も、今年で第17回を迎え、こうして入選句集を皆さまにお届けできることを心から嬉しく思います。

今回の募集期間は、2025年7月1日から9月1日までの約2か月間。連日の厳しい暑さの中にもかわらず、日本国内はもとより、海外29か国から2,232名、合計3,479句ものご応募をいただきました。（昨年は、日本国内および海外29か国から2,397名、3,389句）この熱意とご支援に、心より御礼申し上げます。

審査を進めながら、年々英語俳句への理解や創作意欲が高まり、表現力が豊かになっていることを強く感じました。特に、中学・高校などで指導にあたる先生方が英語俳句に積極的に取り組み、生徒の皆さんを励ましてくださっていることに大きな喜びを覚えます。英語俳句の基本的な考え方——「2～3行からなる短い英詩であり、必ずしも5・7・5や季語にこだわらなくてもよい」というルール——も次第に浸透してきているように思います。

詠まれた作品は、例年同様、自然の美しさを描いたものが多く寄せられましたが、今年は戦争の悲しさや平和への願いを込めた作品が目立ちました。世界の状況を反映しながら、平和を願う声が俳句を通じて広がっていることを改めて感じます。

審査は2段階で行い、1次審査で全作品を精査し、2次審査には、飯島武久氏（山形大学名誉教授・歌人）、万里小路譲氏（詩人）、相馬周一郎氏（山形市文化振興事業団理事長）、リサ・ソマーズ氏（翻訳家）、大場登（大会実行委員長）が参加し、入選作と優秀作を決定しました。その過程で、AIが身近になった今、応募者のオリジナルな作品か否かを見極める必要性を感じたところです。次回以降、応募関係団体の皆さまにも事前にご確認いただくなど、公正な大会運営になるようご協力いただければと存じます。

今や世界の共通語となった「Haiku」。この小さな詩が、人と人とをつなぎ、自然を愛し、人類を思う心を育むきっかけとなることを願ってやみません。来年もまた、多くの方に挑戦していただけることを楽しみにしております。

Foreword:

An English Haiku Contest for the Citizens of the World

This is the 17th year of the Yamadera Basho Memorial Museum English Haiku Contest, which seeks to promote a wider appreciation of the English haiku throughout the world, and we are pleased to present the results of this contest in this year's collection of selected haiku submissions.

In spite of the intense heat that gripped Japan and many other parts of the world during our July 1–September 1 application period, we received a total of 3479 haiku submissions from 2232 applicants (a slight increase over last year's 3389 submissions from 2397 applicants). These submissions came from many parts of Japan as well as 29 foreign countries, and we are grateful to all those who participated in and supported this contest.

Every year, the submissions seem to demonstrate a heightened understanding of the English haiku, in addition to greater creativity and expressiveness. We have been particularly pleased to see the continuing efforts on the part of junior high and high school teachers to instill an enjoyment of the English haiku in their classrooms. Thanks to such efforts, we have seen a gradual acceptance of the principle that the English haiku does not need to be constrained by the 5-7-5 syllable rule or the inclusion of seasonal words, but can enjoy greater freedom as a concise and succinct English poem of two or three lines.

Unsurprisingly, many of this year's haiku submissions celebrated the beauty of nature and revolved around seasonal themes. However, there were also a significant number which articulated the tragedy of war and a desire for peace, as haiku enthusiasts join the growing chorus of voices calling for the resolution of the conflicts which trouble our world.

As in previous years, this year's judging was carried out in two stages. After conducting a first screening to select the works featured in this collection from the entire body of haiku submissions, a second screening was held to determine the Grand Prize and Distinguished Work recipients in each category. The second screening was conducted by Takehisa Iijima (Professor Emeritus of Yamagata University), Joe Maricoji (poet), Shuichiro Soma (Yamagata City Cultural Promotion Foundation Chairman), Lisa Somers (translator) and myself, the Executive Committee Chairman of this haiku contest. This year's second screening included a discussion of the advent of AI, which has become a ubiquitous part of our daily lives. From this time forth, we hope that all individuals and groups submitting works to this contest will make a conscientious effort to ensure the originality of their haiku submissions, supporting our effort to maintain the fairness of this competition.

The haiku has become a universal language that is spoken around the world. In just a few short lines, the haiku poem inspires us to connect with one another, while fostering an appreciation for the natural world and compassion for humanity. We hope that even more individuals around the world will be inspired to try their hand at haiku composition, and we look forward to seeing the fruits of these efforts at next year's contest.
